Jessica Humchitt is an Indigenous Research Analyst for FNHA. Her previous Community Health Programming roles as a Head Start Coordinator and Patient Travel Program manager for home Nation (1998–2009) include maternal child health and home and community care. She has a biomedical background in fluorescent live–cell imaging

research that focuses on mitochondrial dynamics and the neurodegenerative effects of cellular morphology for Parkinson's and Alzheimer's from live-cell samples and neurons. During her time at SFU, she was involved in an NSERC study of antioxidant properties of an Indigenous plant on neurons, Small Numbers/Math Catcher work, and Merck Canada. Other areas of expertise include archaeology and Heiltsuk Traditional Marine Law (Gvilas) Research. She is also a certified MLA1.

Katie Bauder (she/her) is the Research Advisor with the RKE department. Her role involves building research capacity within FNHA and advising on research matters across the organization. She is driven to emphasize strength and wellness-based research approaches to affect systems change and promote
