"Most surgeries require artificial ventilation which can be harmful to lungs. This harm is higher in lung surgeries. Our research shows that lung surgery increases inflammation on both the operated and the non-operated (i.e. ventilated) lung. Our research explores how this leads to worse complications in patients and how to potentially prevent it."
