

COVID-19- Have been working remotely, able to pivot to raise money specifically for COVID-19, including raising money for research. 2019-2020 most successful year yet, raised 40M cash, 60M activity (pledges) have announced goal to raise 225M towards Acute care in new Core hospital- 5 year campaign ends 2022. Charity news indicates 45% of charities are at risk of closing, however the Foundation is not in that 45%, and granted we may be in leaner times but we are in good shape and will be here to support HLI. Looking at next 5 years, which includes supporting the CSRC, Dementia villages. Will be working with you on what the next 5 years of priorities will look like.


2020 Vacation Calendars

IT Update



Privileged Remote Access (PRA)

- Allows users to securely remote in
- They could be accessing workstations or VMs in order to perform their tasks.
- This is a modern secure connection that is secured and does not permit data to be removed
- The service is audited
- Very similar to physician access to patient records with Citrix



Systems Certificates Updated

- All Web and system services had their certificates updated during April
- We are upgrading most / all services
 - Filr,
 - Password Service
 - Directory
 - Database servers
 - Registries
 - Email
 - Accounting software



Storage System Software Upgrade

- The storage system nodes were upgraded
 - Data is evacuated from node (2-3 days)
 - Node is upgraded (2-3 hours)
 - Data is put back on each node (2-3 days)
- New features and security
- Ability to add more nodes will be easier

This upgrade took about 5-6 weeks while users were still active. Have seen a 20% performance increase with this upgrade and additional nodes can be added very easily.



New Intranet Website


- New looking intranet website

Security Software

- Provided by UBC for home use computers
- Downloads available on intranet
 - Cisco Amp
 - Cisco Umbrella

UBC's contracts have ended with one vendor (Sophos) and are now going with Cisco Amp so there is the ability for you to get the product and install it. It is available on our home page so you can install it on your home machine. Please take the time to update patches and updates. If you have any problems installing, call the help desk, its easy to get it installed and working for you, even remotely



Security Software

- The IT team is upgrading most desktops at work, where possible to the new anti-virus package during COVID downtime
- If you are worried about either your work or your home machine, the Help Desk can easily remote and review your configuration – just ask for assistance

Have been upgrading security software on all machines, one area at a time, while you are working from home. If you are concerned about your machine from home, call help desk.



Email address check

- Check to see if any internet accounts you have created with an email address have been compromised
- Look on the intranet for instructions and some tools to help you protect your online accounts

JC: This is important. Quite often when you register for a 3rd party account on an internet site and you use your email address as an account, sometimes these systems become compromised. Go to our intranet site, we have a page there, that you can check to see if your account has been compromised. Always use a different password. Go to our intranet, there are examples of password keys to use (last pass, one pass) you can get no charge versions, that allows you to store all your accounts independently and securely uses encryption. This can be stored locally and transferred to phone and home computer. Contact help desk if you have any questions.

- Research Safety and Risk Services –SRS (formerly RMS UBC) was on site April 23rd to discuss Health & Safety concerns for those currently approved to work under exempted research protocols
- As Safety Officer, I am conducting lab safety walkthroughs every 2 weeks
- The Safety Committee initiated installation of many NEW wall hand sanitization stations throughout HLI
- Sanitization station (spray bottle & wipes) on 2nd floor
 MacDonald and there are Lysol wipes in meeting rooms and other key areas










Webinar Statistics




Feedback Survey – Research Centres

- HLI had <u>tremendous visibility</u> across the UBC Faculty of Medicine and beyond!






Feedback Survey – Current Position








Website Renewal Project Update
