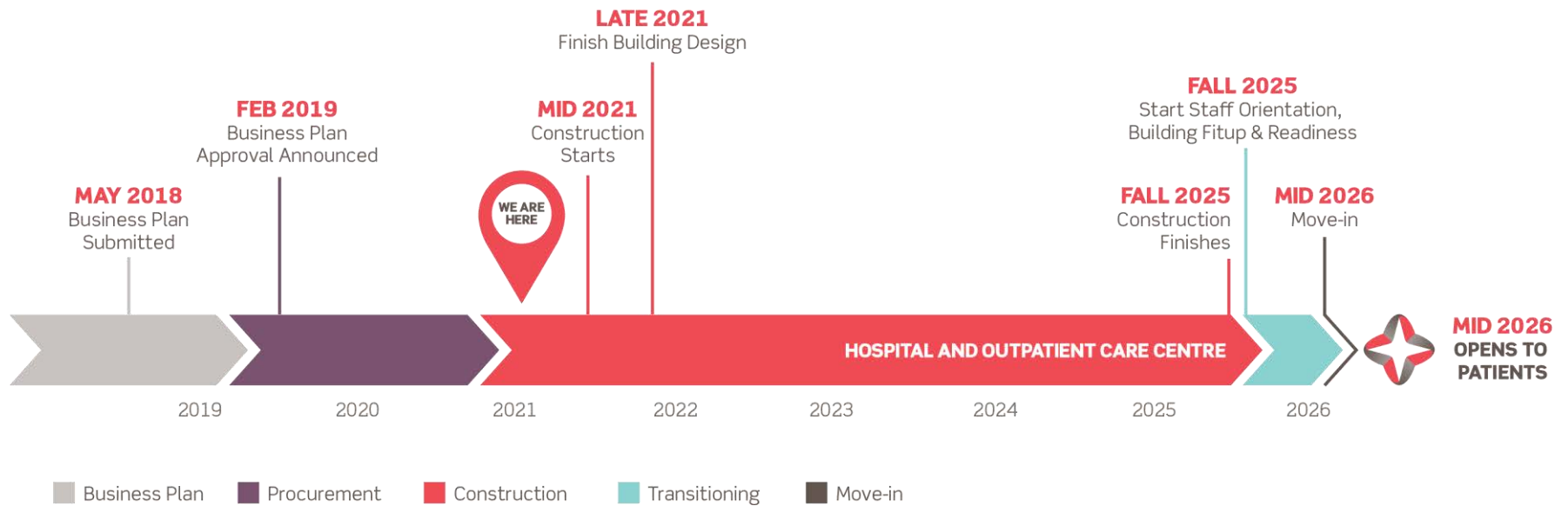

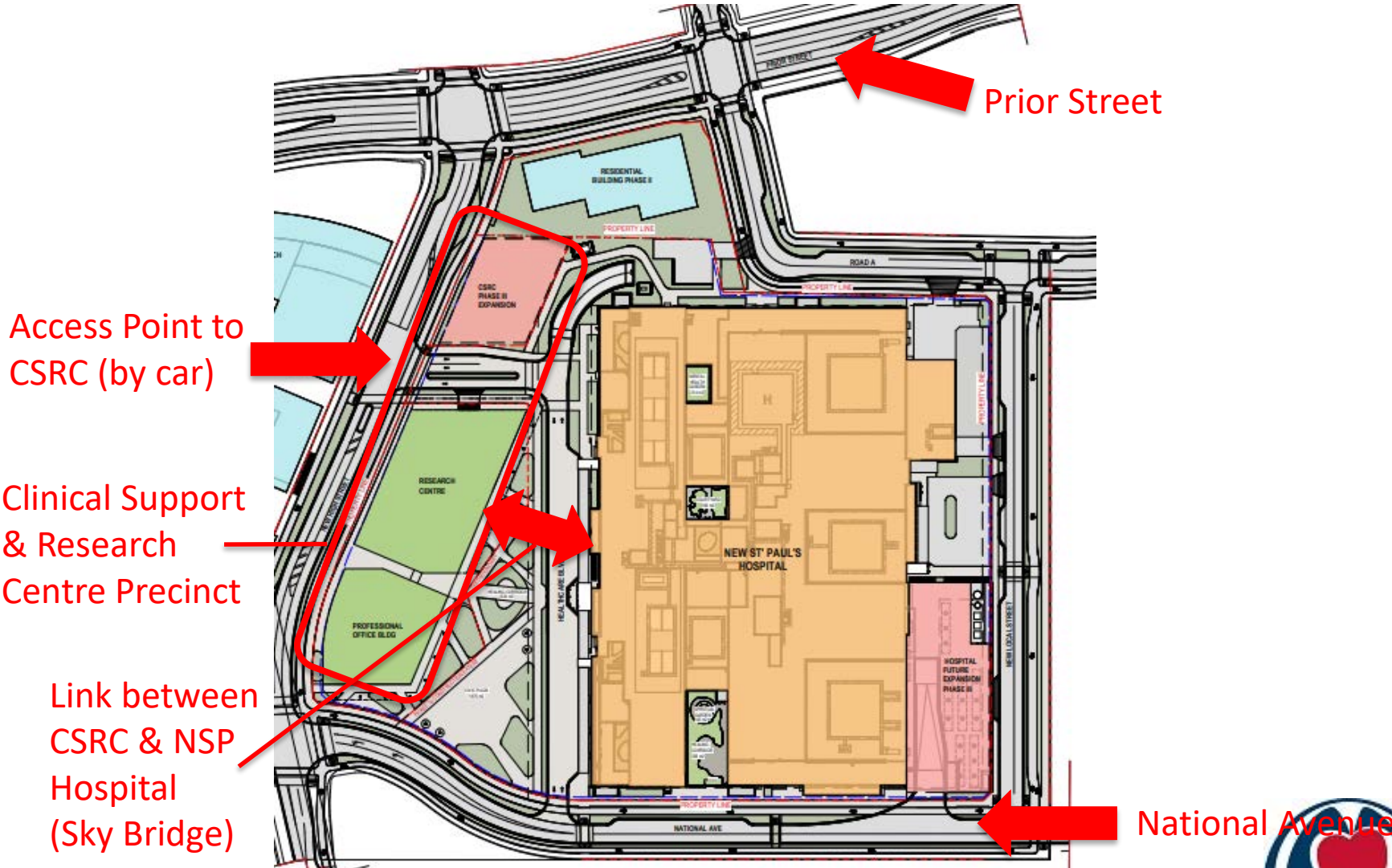

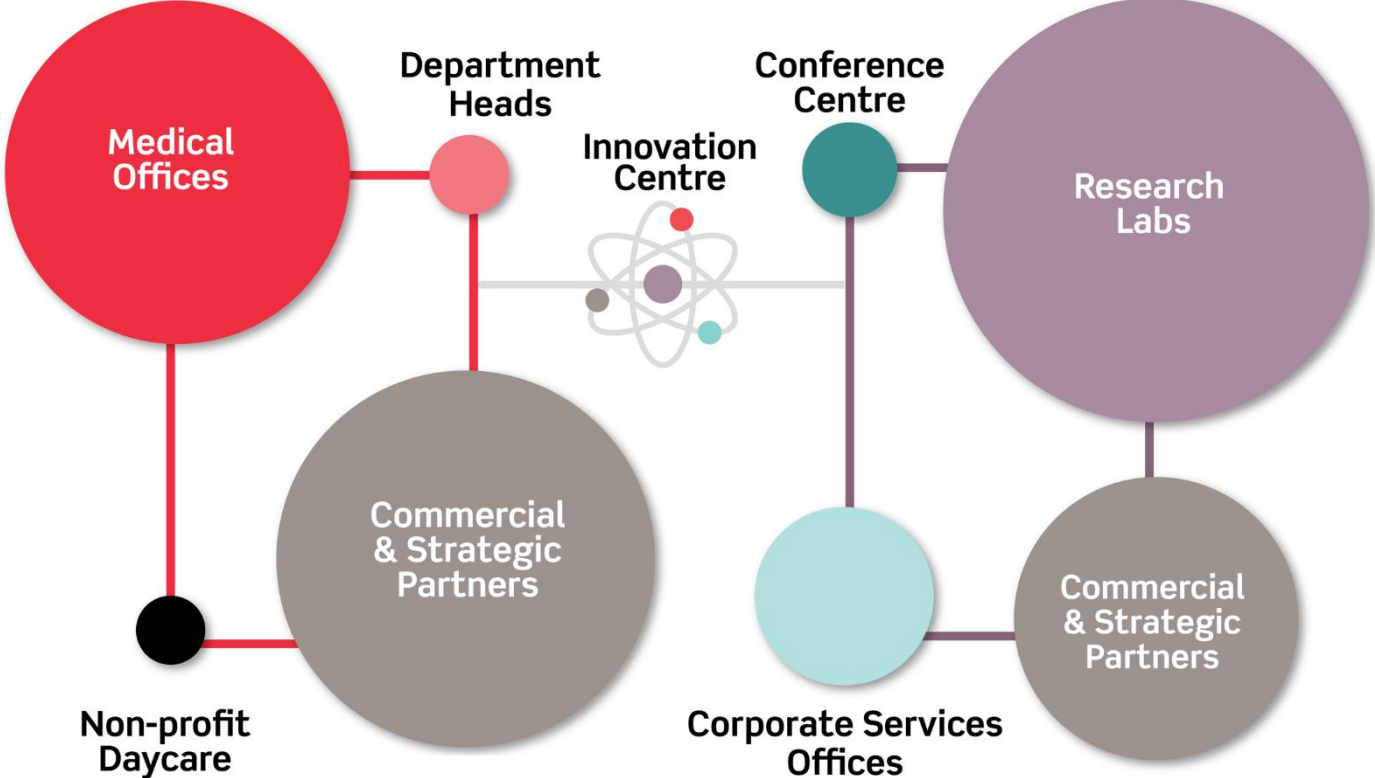


Overview of CSRC Functional Program

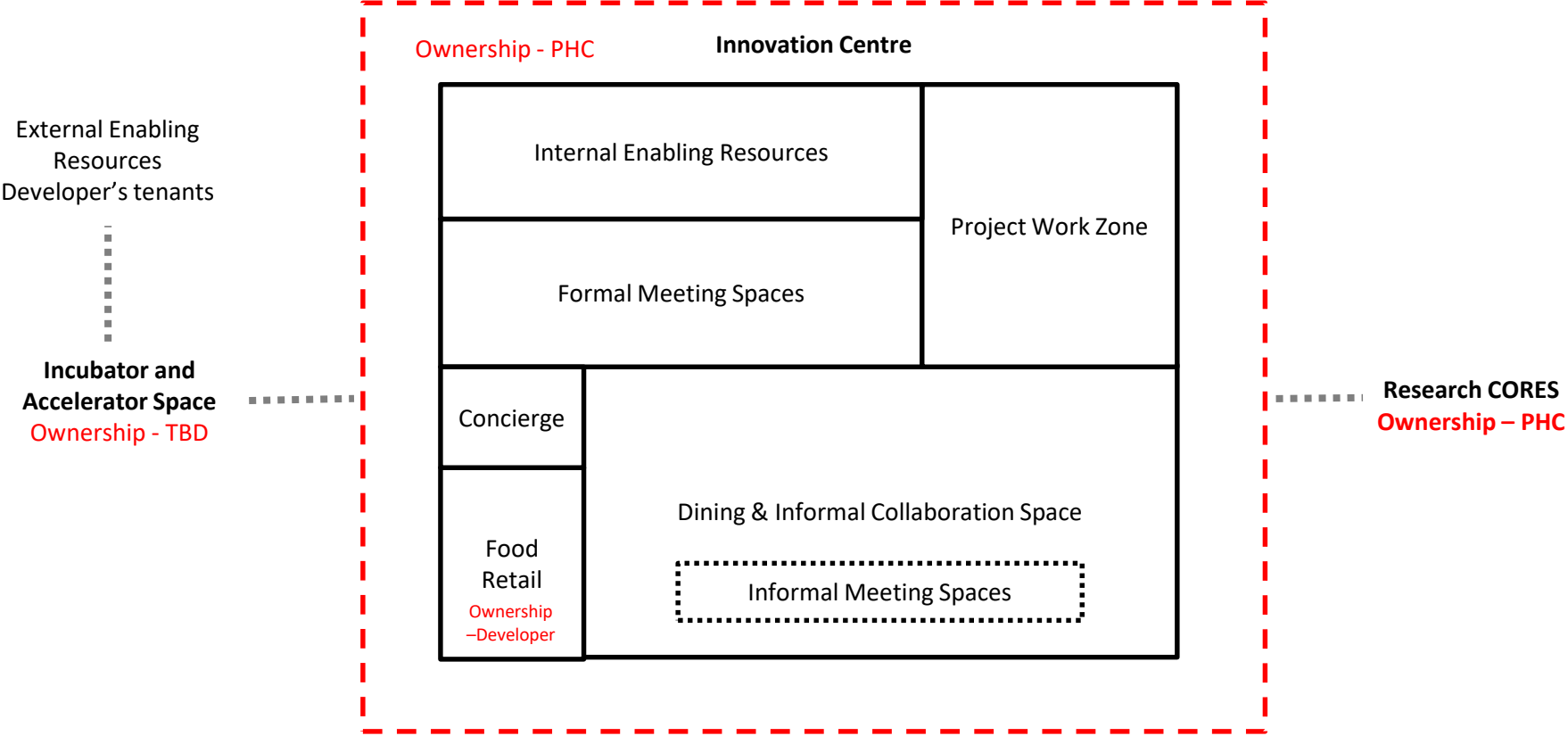

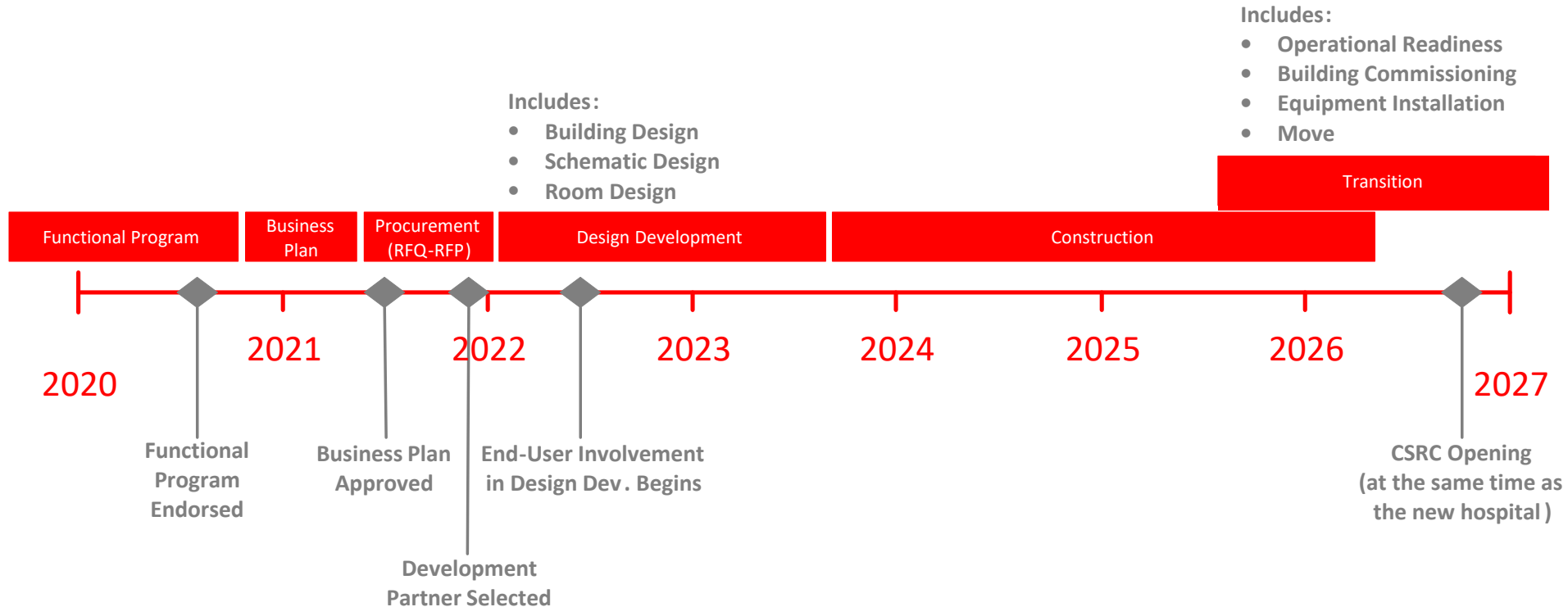

CSRC Project Timeline

Design Development (2022-2023)

- **Breakdown of Design Phases**
- Schematic Design – *January to November 2022*
 - Building Concept (i.e. how many buildings, how many floors, floor size)
 - Rough drawings of a site plan, floor plans and stacking diagram (i.e. what program will go on what floor)
- Design Development – *July 2022 to March 2023*
 - Macro to micro – Progressively working with smaller scale drawings
 - Iterative process working from floor level, to room level to inside the room level (progressively smaller scale drawings)
- Construction Documents – *January to November 2023*
 - Very specific work sessions to decide on hardware, desired finishes, etc.
 - Enough details for the contractor to building the project

**Note that the dates indicated next to each design phase are approximate and they may change.*



End-Users Involvement during Design Development

Role and Responsibilities

- Participate in the design process (i.e. design workshops) by providing feedback on architectural plans based on operational needs and/or constraints.
- Review architectural plans in an iterative process to ensure that they reflect the workshops discussion and to raise concerns over major design issues that could impact operations

Level of Involvement Anticipated

- Schematic Design: Research centres' leadership teams will be consulted
- Design Development: Several working groups will be put in place with multiple HLI end-users organized by sector (most time consuming)
- Construction Documents: Limited involvement, a few end-users may occasionally have to participate to special sessions on specific subjects



Equipment List Update

- **Context**
- A detailed equipment list has been developed in consultation with user groups in 2019-20 for the CSRC Functional Program and Business Plan.
- This list will be used for:
 - Facility design process to inform space and infrastructure requirements; and
 - Move planning which is expected to commence approximately 18-24 months prior to the move to the new site.
- Over the length of the project, the equipment required for the labs will evolve (i.e. older equipment replaced with new technology, new equipment added to inventory). It is critical that the equipment list is kept as up to date as possible
- **Process**
- What: Equipment List (Excel Spreadsheet) for all Wet Lab equipment to be transferred
- Who & How: The list will be distributed by email to Principal Investigators, Lab Managers and other staff who are responsible for managing Wet Lab and/or Core Facilities Equipment
- When: To be done annually, at the beginning of each fiscal year (April)

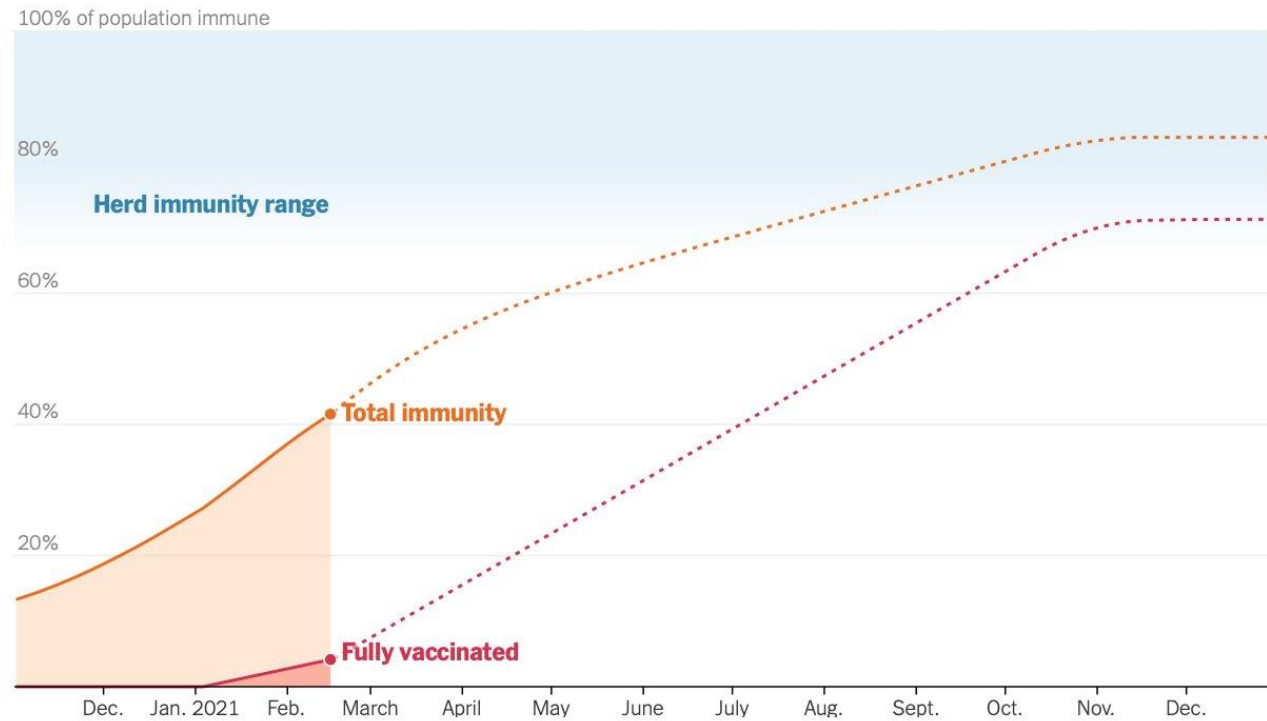

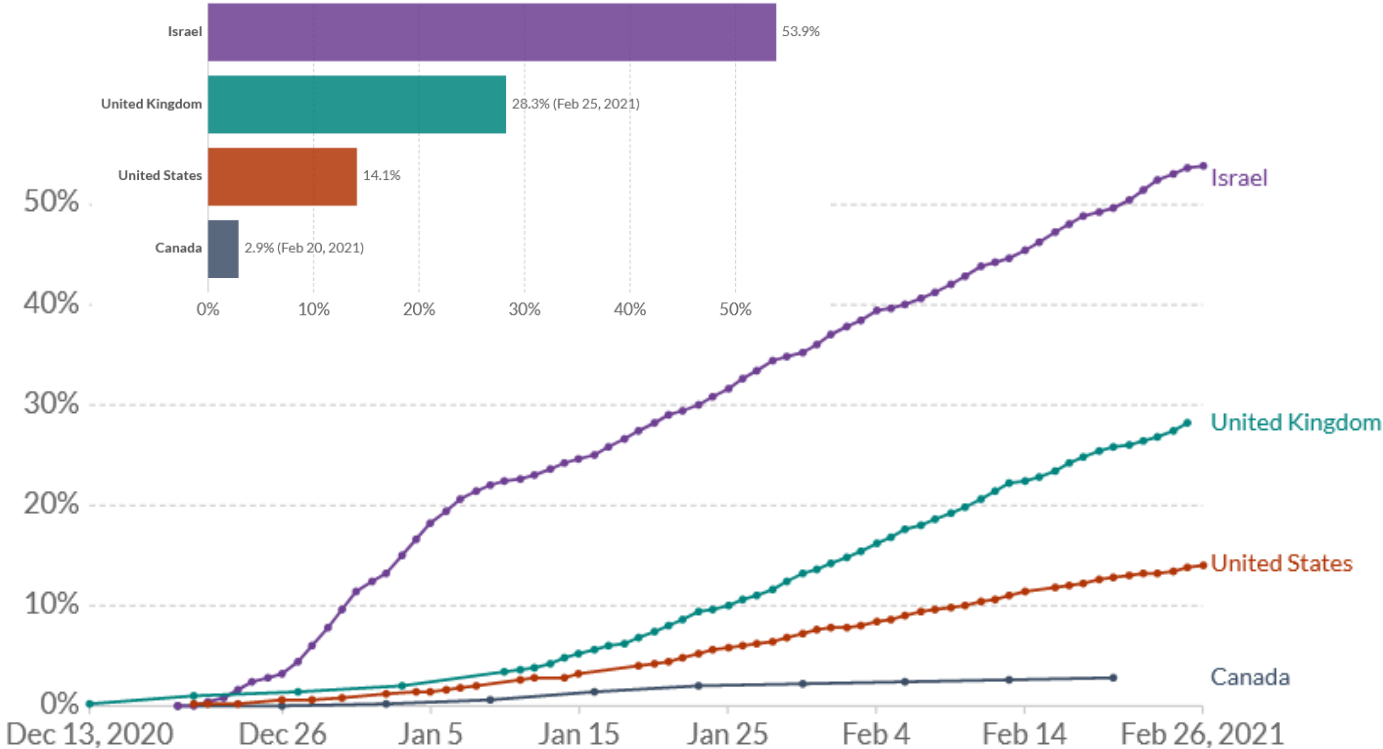


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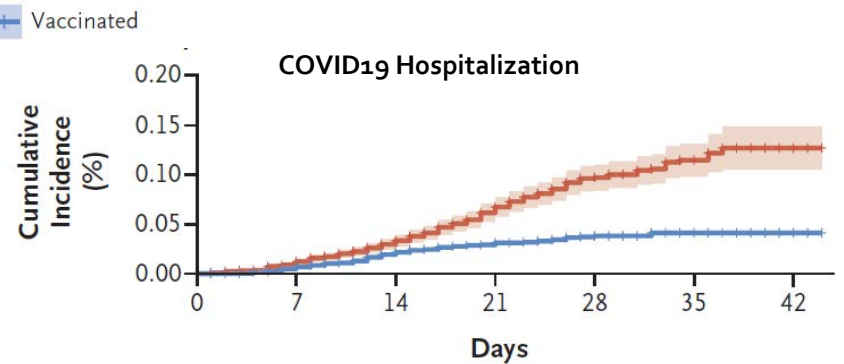
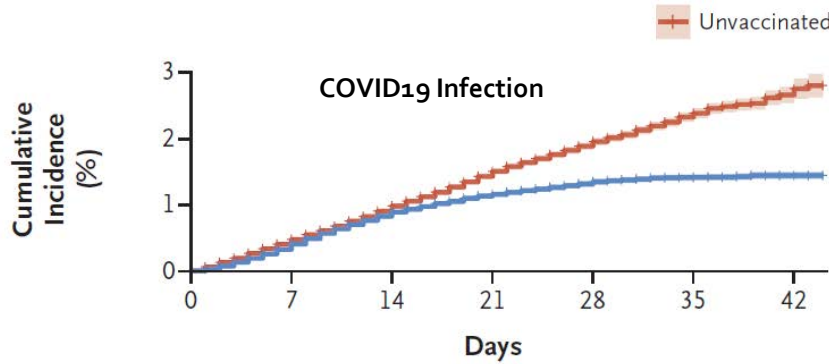


RATE OF VACCINATION IN CANADA & OTHER COUNTRIES

IMPACT OF VACCINATION IN ISRAEL

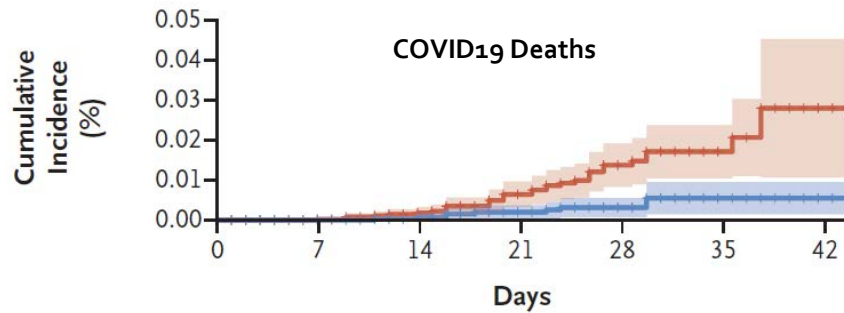

COVID-19 Vaccine Now Available to HLI

- HLI faculty, staff and students who would like to be vaccinated, are invited to check in with the St Paul's vaccine registration desk on vaccine clinic days to sign up for the 'no show waitlist'.
- Vaccine that has been thawed and would otherwise be discarded will be given to those on the waitlist. (approx. 20-30)
- You must sign up in person, and if called get there within 10 minutes and bring your ID badge and care card.
- Desk is on Level 1 by room 1500. Sign up around 900/930 on clinic days, they will know ~ 230 pm if they have leftovers and will start calling those on the waitlist. (**clinics this week Mar 9, 10th,13th**)
