"The severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-Cov-2) is a novel virus that was first identified in December of 2019 through a cluster of pneumonia with unknown origin. The studies of evaluating the impact of comorbidities on the prognosis of patients with Covid-19 have shown that COPD is a risk factor for poor health outcomes. The goal of this systematic review was to determine the role of COPD in the outcomes of patients with COVID-19 and to determine sources of variation of findings across the studies."
