"Cannabis has been gaining popularity in Canada after its legalization. In 2022, 27% Canadians reported using cannabis. Although cannabis use is growing, the effects of smoking cannabis on lung health are poorly understood. Therefore, we aim to study potential risks to lung health related to smoking cannabis. Cannabis smokers perform lung function tests to determine how well they can breathe. Lung images are taken to see any visible problems. Samples are taken from the lungs of cannabis smokers to understand changes in their airways. Studying these health outcomes will help us understand lung health risks associated with cannabis smoking."
